

# Did you know that you may qualify for low cost health insurance?

**The Children's Health Insurance Program, or CHIP**, is a low-cost health coverage program for children under age 19 whose family income is too high to qualify for Medicaid. There may be a small monthly premium (\$10 or \$15, depending on income) for each child enrolled in CHIP. To qualify, a child must live in Idaho and be:

- Under the age of 19
  - A U.S. citizen or legal resident
  - & Within family income guidelines
- Children enrolled in private health insurance are not eligible for CHIP

**If you are not determined eligible for CHIP, you may be eligible for other health coverage assistance programs.**

**Idaho Medicaid** has different programs available that provide health coverage for:

- Children under the age of 19
- Pregnant women
- Adults with a child under the age of 19
- 65 or older
- Individuals who are blind or disabled according to Social Security Administration criteria.

**If you fit one of the categories above, you must also meet the following eligibility criteria:**

- You must be a citizen or legal immigrant, and
- You must be a resident of the State of Idaho, and
- Your household income must be less than the program income limits for your household size, and
- Your resources must not exceed the program resource limits.
